Parents are asked to have their children at Johnson Park by 8:45am. Students should be dressed in their red or gold sports shirts, green shorts or skorts, shoes and their school hat. We suggest parents apply sunscreen before the event starts and provide an individual water bottle for each child. It is the responsibility of parents to transport their children to and from the Sports Day. You are not required to go to the school, please go to Johnson Park instead.

There will be no school bus service to and from Johnson Park. We expect the day to be finished by 2:45pm. No staff will be at school—all will be at Johnson Park. We will have the school mobile in case you need to contact us.

Students must stay with their house group on the grandstand if not competing in events. Parents are welcome to bring fold-up chairs to sit between the grandstand area and the big discus cage. There are plenty of shady trees to sit under. All younger siblings must be closely supervised and we ask that everyone refrain from going on the running track. The playground is out of bounds for all Aloomba students. Students must see the teachers in the grandstand upon arrival to get the roll marked and age number marked on arm. In case of wet weather, please be prepared with towels, raincoats etc.

Staff may need assistance to run events, and on the day are appreciative of your offers to help.
